Historic Rosland Campground: 40 acre park with 11 campsites, day use area and river access.

Finley Butte Community Park: Community building, snack shack, new playground area, one ball field and open space.

John C Johnson Building: Community Conference Room, four office space rental units.

White School Park Complex: Large Community Building, outdoor stage, large lawn area.

Audia Park: Unimproved property, approx 3 acres. Natural riparian area adjacent to the Little Deschutes River

Leona Park: Unimproved property, approx 2 acres. Natural riparian area adjacent to the Little Deschutes River.

Vacant 5 Acre Lot: Unimproved near the high school.
